HAMBLETON VILLAGE COMMUNITY FOCUS

German prisoners of war in Hambleton

(This article also includes a little social history of the period)

My wife Shirley received her first official wage packet at the age of eight. She was a young land girl and worked the fields of this area with her parents and other workers. The family came on a Monday and left on Fridays – for the six weeks of the school holidays. They came from Dewsbury but people came from different areas to work on this land. Their family accommodation was a small wooden hut. The hut had no beds and no cooking facilities – in fact it had nothing. Her father made three hammock type beds with old carpet and wood, they used an old paraffin stove to heat up whatever they could scrounge for food. Although she cannot remember exactly where she worked with her parents, she remembers clearly travelling down Selby road from Leeds in the back of an open backed truck. She also remembers clearly German prisoners of war working in the same area. There was a German POW camp where the new housing development is under way near the golf course – where the old mushroom farm used to be. Its official title in 1945 was *Sandbeds POW Camp 53*. The address was given as *Gateforth Road, Brayton Nr Selby*. It is also known that German prisoners were in Hambleton at this time 1945. There is good reason to believe that these prisoners may well have been working in the fields around Hambleton village. Shirley also remembers on occasions being driven further down the main road and through Selby, then over the toll bridge. It would seem that camp 53 may have supplied quite a large area.

Shirley's younger brother sadly died just before her dad (*in the army*) was due to be shipped overseas, he was granted compassionate leave for the funeral – then shipped out to India, then to Burma. Shirley didn't see her father for the next five years. He couldn't get any work after discharge from the army, *along with many others at that time*, apart from land work – that is how he ended up in this area with his wife and daughter working in the fields. He had also lost a brother (*Shirley's uncle*) killed by the Germans in France – (*Shirley also had an uncle who was a POW in Burma*) so after serving in the army for six years, it is easy to understand why her dad wasn't too fond of working very close to German prisoners. Shirley was instructed to keep away from the Germans. Now we have to remember that my future wife Shirley, was only eight at the time and probably like most eight year old girls, didn't always do as she was told. She duly made contact with the Germans. Her memories here are not too strong but she can remember speaking to them, whilst watching them working, some of them spoke reasonable English. Her recollections are only of them being nice to her and being very friendly. Shirley's work *when not talking to the Germans*, was weeding carrot fields and picking peas, She remembers clearly the pay for pea picking was *sixpence a peck*, which apparently was quite a large container. It was not forced labour for children but even so – the work was fairly hard if one wanted to get that pay packet with a few bob in it on a Friday.

When Shirley left school at fifteen, the woollen mills in the Dewsbury area which had drastically reduced production during the war years, started to increase production again. She joined her mum and dad working on the weaving looms. This was extremely dangerous work and so noisy it was impossible to converse. The hours were seven am to five thirty pm, with one hour break per day. She made friends with some Italian girls who were working on the looms, but she couldn't converse with them because of the extreme noise levels, so she took the girls home with her after work and whilst improving their limited English, she picked up basic Italian. After a few weeks they were able to communicate by using sign language and lip reading, in a mixture of English and Italian – and whilst operating a weaving loom – quite an amazing achievement I would say. My future wife did mill work until she was nineteen. Life wasn't too easy for children who lived through the war years – they then had to endure the post war years. A bit different now isn't it?

HAMBLETON VILLAGE

Shirley and I have lived in Hambleton for twenty two years. My first visit here was in 1969 when I was called out to Gateforth hospital to sort out some X/ray problems – Shirley was working here twenty four years before me. It was just pure chance that brought us to live in Hambleton certainly not any past memories. It is only recently that she has talked in any detail of her experiences all those years ago – it was these conversations and a bit of digging that prompted this article. The attached picture was acquired by me along with other old pictures of Hambleton and Gateforth. I cannot claim it was of this area but it does seem likely. I cannot claim that Shirley and her family actually worked in the Hambleton area – but again it seems very likely from the information I have obtained. I cannot claim that the German prisoners in the picture were the ones that Shirley made friends with and spoke to – we will never know, it seems unlikely – but just maybe...

Envoi.

During my working life I spent some time in Bavaria, Germany. I can clearly remember having conversations about the war years, with local men (*of similar age to myself*) who I met in and around Erlangen, where I stayed. I had similar exchanges in Nuremberg and Munich – which I also visited. To be expected I did meet some men who had been Prisoners in England. Without exception they spoke of the fairness and the decent way they were treated by the people of England. I didn't know where they were held in England nor did I have any reason to ask at that time – (*over fifty years ago*) but I am sure, that they would have been treated with the same respect and kindness, if they had found themselves in *Sandbeds POW camp 53* and in the fields around Hambleton.
