PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

These pages will give you an update on what the Parish Council have been dealing with and any issues that have been brought to our attention. Parish Council Meetings are held every second Thursday of the month, please check the Notice Board or website <u>www.hambleton-pc.gov.uk</u> for the most recent Minutes. An Agenda for the next meeting will be posted 3 days in advance of the meeting on the Notice Board.

BUDGET AND PRECEPT

As you may know, the Parish Council request money every year from the District Council to enable them to carry out the day to day running of the village; for example, landscape maintenance of the village green, the play area and the Recreation Field.

The budget was discussed at the January meeting and Council agreed that there would be **no rise** to households in Hambleton. Therefore on receipt of your council tax bill, it will show no increase for the Parish Council Precept section.

PARISH COUNCIL OWNED HOUGH

(The small side of the Hough) For information, the annual Bracken clearance took place just before Christmas, this will allow the fresh spring growth through.

HAMBLETON HOUGH

Clerk was informed that the work taking place on the Hough is tree planting and the contractors that are carrying out the planting should have completed the planting of over 4000 trees by this Spring.

A63 ROAD SAFETY

Following the loss of yet another crossing patrol officer, the Parish Council have requested that a Risk Assessment is carried out by North Yorkshire County Council to gather up to date traffic information centred around the busy times of day including school bus pick up/drop off, primary school drop off/pick up and peak commuting times. With the data the Parish Council hope to be able to discuss how safety can be improved through the village. NYCC accept there is a risk, otherwise a crossing patrol would not have been in place, therefore as a crossing patrol cannot be found, an alternative solution must be found. The Parish Council are as frustrated with the situation as residents and it has requested a crossing from NYCC many times over the years to no avail. It is hopeful, that with updated data and the fact that the village has grown and the backing of the residents, it can convince NYCC of the benefits for the whole village.

ELECTIONS MAY 2020

Elections for the North Yorkshire Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner will be held on Thursday 7th May 2020. The Village Hall will be the Polling Station as usual.

RECYCLING

Please see the information provided from Selby District Council on Page 4 regarding the new process for recycling starting in April. New bins are currently being distributed throughout North Yorkshire but will not be emptied until the collection scheme is up and running in March/April. Please continue to your current boxes until then. Green bin collection dates and regularity will stay the same.

NEW RECYCLING SERVICE

Information from www.selby.gov.uk/sorted-recycling-service

The way we collect your recycling is changing. You'll receive two new wheelie bins.

- The blue one is for glass, cans and plastic
- The brown one is for paper and cardboard



We're not changing the type of materials we collect. We're just changing the containers you put your recycling in so you have more room to recycle. This is in response to what you said about how you want the service to operate.

The new service starts at the end of March/beginning of April. Importantly we'll be delivering your new bins from Monday 20 January. We're delivering bins to over 40,000 homes, so it'll take us around ten weeks to complete all the deliveries <u>Please continue to use your existing boxes until the end of March/beginning of April.</u>

Leader of the Council, Cllr Mark Crane explained, "The existing system of separate recycling boxes was introduced because at the time there were no nearby recycling sorting plants that we could take this material straight to. "We carried out a detailed review of the service, which included a major consultation that more than 6,700 residents took part in. We want to make sure our service is in line with the Government's long-term waste strategy – keeping paper and card separate to other recyclable material – which is why two new bins are needed. The new wheelie bin system will allow us to collect high quality material and will be easier for householders to use.

"Moving to wheelie bins will give nearly 50% more room to recycle and we hope that our residents will embrace the opportunity to boost their recycling."

Collection timetable remains the same. More information about the new service is available here - <u>www.selby.gov.uk/</u> welcome-our-recycling-and-waste-service.

We use a contractor to carry out waste collections. The current contract is with Amey Plc.

- What about the old boxes?

We know many of you will be able to reuse your boxes for example, for storage.

If you can't reuse them we'll be setting up 12 bring sites spread out across the district where residents can drop them off for recycling. The bring sites are yet to be confirmed - we'll update this page with the details as soon as it is confirmed.

We're also making alternative arrangements for those who might struggle to drop the boxes off at these sites - so residents who are on our assisted collections service will have their old boxes collected if they don't wish to keep them. - Access Problems

Sometimes, we may have problems emptying your bin. Outside factors such as parked cars or roadworks can create access difficulties and our vehicle may not be able to enter your road. Where this is the case, we will return to the area with the access problem twice within that day to try and empty the bins. Where access is still not available, we will try and return the next day. If access is still not available we will arrange an alternate collection.



HAMBLETON VILLAGE COMMUNITY FOCUS

The House on Back Lane

Albert came from Ricall and Blanche came from Monk Fryston. They met and married and lived in Monk Fryston for a short time before moving to Hambleton – to The house on Back Lane. There were only three very old houses on Back Lane at that time, none had names or numbers. The house in question is still very much in use at the corner of Back Lane and Station Road today. Albert and Blanche started to produce their family in Back Lane and managed to produce eight children. Charles Albert Howcroft (*who this vignette is about*) was number five – his siblings were in order of appearance – Les, Alf, Vi, Eddy, Edith, Audrey and Alec.

Charles Albert who has always been know as 'Bert' was born in 1923 and by the time you read this he will be 96 years old. He remembers during his young days roaming the wide open spaces and woodlands around Hambleton with his siblings. When Bert was five years old he started at Hambleton school and can recall with great detail these early days in his life. This building which was also used frequently for village dances and



also as a church, is alas no more – it was demolished for houses not too long ago. Bert left junior school in Hambleton when he reached eleven and went to Flaxley Road school in Selby. His Family then moved to Chapel Street to a house with more rooms and large gardens. Bert remembers this house in Chapel Street with great affection.

He left Selby School at fourteen and worked with his father who was a joiner in Brayton. When he was seventeen the war was well under way and Bert joined the local *home guard*, he remembers clearly patrolling the area with his rifle and bayonet and doing night time plane spotting on the Hough. If planes were spotted, the information about numbers and types was sent by radio to Leeds to give advance warning of possible raids. He recalls it being all very exciting for a very young man. At eighteen as expected Bert was called up to serve in the army. He spent time in North Africa and can recall in much detail most of his experiences there. He then moved *with the war* to Italy and can recall again in great detail his time there also. It was while serving in Italy that Bert met the young Italian lady *'Concetta'* who would later become his wife. Concetta, known as Tina, joined Bert in Hambleton after the war – they were married in Hambleton church and lived in Chapel Street – in a home built for returning exservice men. Their marriage produced five children. Kevin, Jenny, Bobby, Gerard and Ann Marie, who all survive. Tina sadly died fifteen years ago and is buried in Hambleton cemetery.

Bert now lives alone in Church Close but is very well looked after and enjoys listening to music, watching television and talking. His short term memory is not too good these days but he has disclosed things to me from his past, especially during his war years in Italy that I am sworn to secrecy about...

I'm sure you would all like to send 96 year old Bert your best wishes and I sincerely hope I can add to this vignette when Bert reaches his century...



Dear Neighbour,

East Coast Main Line Power Supply Upgrade - Hambleton Junction

I am writing to inform you that Network Rail is planning work in your area as part of a wider project to upgrade the East Coast Main Line. The proposed work will involve the construction of a new electricity substation and Static Frequency Convertor (SFC) compound at Hambleton Junction (post code YO8 9HZ).

Works are set to commence from the **27 January 2020.** Initial deliveries to allow the site set up and construction of the haul road to the north of the site will be made during the hours of 7:00 and 17:00 along Scalm Lane, or via an alternative route off the A63. Deliveries will be managed around school drop off and pick up time to not coincide with these busier periods. There will be no parking up of large machinery within the village.

We understand that working close to and travelling through your village is far from ideal. Unfortunately, the equipment required to carry out the construction will mean disturbance is unavoidable, but we will make every effort to minimise any unnecessary disruption. Furthermore, those working are briefed on working responsibly in the local community.

Happy New Year!

Following the rush of Christmas, I think we all heave a bit of a sigh of relief when it comes to the start of a New Year – unless we've embarked on ambitious New Year's Resolutions, of course! I am seeing signs of new life in our garden with snowdrops and the very first primroses appearing despite the miserable weather, there is hope for spring!

The world seems to be a very insecure place at the moment with changes beginning to our relationship with our closest neighbours in Europe, changes to the way our Royal Family operates, tensions in the Middle East and on-going environmental disasters in Australia, and many other parts of the world. Change is always unsettling, but for Christians we have the assurance that, even though things may change around us, God's love and faithfulness do not change, and we can grow in confidence that he is with us and longs for us to experience the security of a close relationship with him.

As well as our regular pattern of services, to which everyone is always welcome (see below), we will have some special events in church in the next few weeks.
