



On 22nd September the Government announced new measures to supress the virus following numerous outbreaks, including a sharp increase in infections in the Selby District. Now, more than ever, we must take extra care as we go about our daily lives.

No more than 6 people should meet socially. This is now a law. For details and exceptions, refer to gov.uk coronavirus outbreak FAQs what you can and cant do

North Yorkshire County Council have implemented an <u>Outbreak Plan</u> and support the use of the NHS Test and Trace programme and App.

Please download the NHS Test and Trace App - this will allow you to check in to public venues such as the local pub hassle free via the QR code scanner - it will also give you risk alerts by postcode, a symptom checker and test booking facility.

Many people are asymptomatic and do not know they have the virus, they will carry on as normal, infecting people along the way. Be considerate, you may be one of these people, follow the advice: Wash your hands - Wear a mask - Give people space.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

An Agenda for the next meeting will be posted 3 days in advance of the meeting on the Notice Board.

MAIN ROAD A63

Following a meeting with NYCC, locations and styles for the Parish Council's Vehicle Activated Signs (VAS) have been given permission and the Parish Council is pleased to be able to provide an updated and improved alternative to the Temporary signs that are currently installed by NYCC. The new signs (right) incorporate more up to date technology and have an alternating Slow Down safety message and a bright LED output, they will also capture data that can be submitted to the police. The signs can be moved between different locations along the main road, helping to avoid them becoming part of the background scenery.

As expected, discussions are ongoing with Highways regarding a potential pedestrian crossing; the Parish Council will be able to update the village as progress is made.

Hambleton A63 Road Safety group have installed two signs on the Village Green in accordance with NYCC regulations and we all hope this signage along with the new VAS will remind drivers to check their speed through the village. The group are also registering as a Community Speed Watch group which will be a fantastic benefit to the village. REMEMBRANCE SERVICE

Last year saw a gathering at the War Memorial on the Village Green and laying of wreaths. This year, the restrictions on social gatherings are likely to affect the way the service is carried out, plans will be announced in due course.

VANDALISM: RECREATION AREA

After a scheduled maintenance check, various items of equipment at the Park and Recreation Area have been repaired. The check also highlighted some damage to the

Multi Use Games Area (MUGA) at the recreation field that unfortunately was thought to have been done deliberately. This picture shows how panels are being kicked to leave dangerous spikes protruding from the something inspector had never seen happen before.



Because of tight safety

regulations, there is no way to partially replace these panels as there is no safe way to cover over the gap left. What seems a relatively minor amount of damage means each full panel will need to be replaced - a cost of around £3000. The Parish Council feels that this area is important to our village and will have to use precept funds that could have been utilised on other projects. The replacements will be carried out following the installation of CCTV at the Recreation Area. The Parish Council is exploring ways of improving the facilities at the recreation ground.

MARKING REMEMBRANCE DAY AMID THE PANDEMIC

Remembrance Day 2020 is likely to be very different to past years, but we shouldn't allow coronavirus to prevent us recognising and celebrating our veterans. That's why we are • offering gift boxes to older ex-servicemen and women in North Yorkshire. Funded by the Armed Forces Covenant Fund Trust, boxes will include a collection of Yorkshirethemed items, including biscuits and teabags, as well as commemorative items from the Royal British Legion's Poppyshop.

The packs are free of charge and will be delivered in early November, arriving in time for Remembrance Sunday. (Packs are suitable for both men and women.)

To be eligible for a pack, veterans must:

- be aged 65 or over;
- have served in HM Armed Forces (including National Service) or have seen active service as part of the Merchant Navy;
- live in one of the North Yorkshire districts (i.e. Craven, Hambleton, Harrogate, Richmondshire, Ryedale, Scarborough or Selby).

WHAT3WORDS

Being able to give your precise location in an emergency can save vital time and lives.

What3words is now used by 80% emergency services in the UK. Their system has given every 3m square in the world a unique identifier made of three words, making the location of any incident very easy to describe and share...

For example ///tortoises.swarm.announce will take you to a precise location on Ben Nevis where, in February 2020, a group of hikers were rescued.

The system can also be used to locate rural crime such as Fly-Tipping and Anti-Social Behaviour, or incidents with organisations like National Grid, Network Rail or the Environment Agency.

HAMBLETON ISOLATION HELP GROUP

The latest Government Guidance issued 22nd September includes:



Wash hands regularly for at least 20 seconds





Cover your face in enclosed spaces, hospitality venues when not seated, public transport including taxis, although the NYLRF suggest that while infections in a particular area are increasing that they are worn when you leave the house. Try not to share a car with someone who is not from your household or social bubble.



Stay 2 metres apart where possible, or 1 metre with extra precautions in place.



Rule of 6, groups of people should be no more than six. Children are included in the group of 6 in England.

Unfortunately new rules have restricted our social groups again but our fitness and out of school activities groups are still able to continue.

We have lost our regular Saturday night booking for Whist groups unfortunately, with most of their members being in the vulnerable category and no sign of the situation becoming safe enough for them to risk meeting, they decided it would be sensible to discontinue the group. CURRRENT VILLAGE HALL CONTROL MEASURES:

- hand sanitiser dispensers at the front door, in the kitchen and in the main hall.
- sanitising spray and blue roll to clean surfaces, touch points and equipment before and after use.
- smaller lidded pedal bins; we will need you to empty the bins you have used after your session into the large external in.
- The external bin is now emptied weekly, and our cleaning contractors are paying specific attention to sanitising all the touch points such as switches and handles.
 - Each group leader must have contact details of people attending their session for NHS Test and Trace purposes and management must have contact details for the group leader.
- Our COVID -19 Risk Assessment includes control measures your group can implement to reduce the risk of spreading the disease.

History of Hostelries in Hambleton

The oldest public houses in Hambleton were the Wheatsheaf and the Red Lion. The earliest reference found so far for both the Wheatsheaf and the Red Lion is in an Extract from History, Directory & Gazetteer of Yorkshire, 1822 when John Palframan was the victualler of the Wheat Sheaf and John Potter of the Red Lion.

As well as the pubs in 1837 there was at least one beerhouse in the village run by James Bleasby. In 1870 the local policeman gave evidence against a William Bleasby who had allowed beer to be drunk after 10p.m. The Beerhouse Act in 1830 enabled people to apply for a licence to sell beer in their house and removed the tax on



beer. Beer drinking was encouraged as spirit drinking, in particular gin, was believed to lead to drunkenness and detrimental to the working classes. The Act also extended the open houses of licenced premises to 4a.m. to 10p.m.


The Red Lion (top left) was also described as an Hotel. The Goole Times in July 1896 reported that the Hambleton Lodge of the Good Shepherds met for their Annual Club Walk at the Red Lion Inn and later in the day they met in their club room for a meal provided by the landlord Walter Bowman for upward of 100 people. Once the business meeting was over they held a dance. In 1890 the Red Lion Inn with outbuildings, granary and cottage was sold for £770. Property sales were also held in the Red Lion.



The picture of the Wheatsheaf (below left) was taken between 1921 and 1923 when Henry Redman (the name over the door in the photo) and his wife Eileen Jane were listed as living there during that time. The Wheatsheaf also acted as more than a public house at times as in 1853 the inquest to the two

railway men killed in the crash just outside Hambleton Station was held there. The Wheatsheaf was the first pub in the village to have electricity which was provided by the generator owned Chilvers by Palframan and used to run the mill.

The Owl was not opened until 1937 when H. Seller licensee of The Wheatsheaf, owned by Stanley Whittaker Tinsdale, applied for a licence at Hambleton House to be called "Owl" Country Club although in some advertisements in the late 1930s it was described as "Owl" Roadhouse. During its life as a country club many stars of the time including Teddy Johnson & Pearl Carr performed there. They held numerous dinner dances, the one on 25th August, 1973 would have cost £1.75 plus 10% VAT.

We are planning to hold a Remembrance Day service at **9.15am on November 8th in Church**. Please come promptly to be sure of a seat, once all available seats have been allocated we will not be able to admit extra people.

Because of the current restrictions and the rapidly changing advice we have not made firm plans for our Christmas celebrations.
