# HAMBLETON ISOLATION HELP GROUP

#### **Hambleton Isolation Help Group**

The Government announced the lifting of social restrictions from 19th July. However this does not mean that the risks from COVID-19 have disappeared. Instead it marks a new phase in the Government's response to the pandemic during which people need to manage the risks to themselves and others as the country learns to live with the virus.

The Government has set out the following behaviours which are beneficial:

- Meeting in well-ventilated areas where possible, such as outdoors or indoors with windows open.
- Wearing a face covering where you come into contact with people you don't normally meet in enclosed and crowded spaces.
- Washing your hands with soap and water or using hand sanitiser regularly throughout the day.
- Covering your nose and mouth when you cough and sneeze.









Despite the lifting of restrictions people who are extremely clinically vulnerable are advised to continue to take extra steps to reduce the risk of infection with COVID 19.

HiHG volunteers will continue to be available if you need support with shopping or collecting prescriptions, as some people are still being asked to self isolate or are clinically vulnerable.

# PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

These pages will give you an update on what the Parish Council have been dealing with and any issues that have been brought to our attention. Parish Council Meetings are held every second Thursday of the month, please check the Notice Board or website <a href="www.hambleton-pc.gov.uk">www.hambleton-pc.gov.uk</a> for the most recent Minutes. An Agenda for the next meeting will be posted 3 days in advance of the meeting on the Notice Board.

#### **PARISH COUNCIL MEETINGS**

PC meetings are now required by law to be held in person and online meetings are no longer allowed. The current Covid-19 restrictions allow for the meeting of councillors to carry out the business of the Parish Council but the Hambleton Parish Councillors have agreed to endeavour to make the meetings brief and focussed to reduce the amount of time gathered indoors together. Dates and times of meeting will be advertised in the noticeboard and online at least three clear days in advance. The PC would like to discourage residents from coming along to simply observe the discussions for the same reason, but if you have an issue you would like to specifically discuss at a PC Meeting, please email the clerk with your query: info@hambleton-pc.gov.uk Dates and times of meeting will be advertised in the noticeboard and online at least three clear days in advance.

#### **AGAR**

The Independent Internal Auditor has confirmed there are no issues of concern with the accounts. The AGAR 20-21 documents have been submitted as per requirements.

#### **NEW PLAYGROUND ROUNDABOUT**

Finally the new roundabout has been fitted at Garth Drive Park, along with surfacing required by safety standards; the grass will eventually grow through as it did round the 'flying saucer' roundabout in the park. We hope the new equipment is enjoyed and used as much as the old one.

#### **PUBLIC CONSULTATIONS**

There will be further public consultations regarding the future you want to see for our village; notice for these will go in the noticeboard at the top of Chapel Street and be circulated via Social Media channels as details are confirmed. The consultation process is a long process with many opportunities for you to get involved, the Parish Council looks forward to hearing your views.

#### **HEDGES AND VEGETATION**

If your boundary hedges and vegetation could impede people using the paths, please check they are cut back to leave enough room for people with prams, wheelchairs, toddlers or all of the above and anything in between.

Thank you to everyone who continues to maintain hedges and vegetation to keep the village looking tidy and keep the paths clear, it is very much appreciated.

The PC has been made aware of a number of complaints to NYCC Highways about pavements in the village being blocked by overgrown vegetation - NYCC policy is to conduct a site visit and notify the homeowner of any work that needs to take place to clear the footway; if the work is not done by the homeowner, it will be carried out by NYCC and charged to the homeowner.



The PC continues to report overgrown village hedges and vegetation to relevant authorities the responsible for their maintenance. Hedges cannot be cut March -September due to nesting season (Wildlife and Countryside Act) and the farmers generally cut them as late possible February. Thank you for your patience on this matter.

#### **Hambleton Hough Update**

With the current state of the main side of Hambleton Hough raising concerns amongst residents, the PC approached the Wildlife Habitat Protection Trust regarding the paths that are deteriorating and the future plans for cutting back and maintenance. The Wildlife Habitat Protection Trust began to lease the land from Selby District Council in 2012 as reported in Citizenlink Autumn 2012.

#### Martin Blakey, Wildlife Habitat Protection Trust responded:

"...the few saplings you refer to amounts to 4000 new trees planted which is about 2000 more than we took out. Unfortunately, due to configurations of the Hough there will be some amount of natural subsidence, this happened before we took over and will continue to happen as this is just a natural occurrence."

"We are trying to maintain a woodland as natural as possible, not create a place for people to walk with immaculate pathways as this is defeating the object, it is at the end of the day a woodland with paths running through it and we intend to keep it that way. We do not do any maintenance on any of our sites during the bird nesting season for obvious reasons but will as always carry out regular walkovers after the nesting season is over and clear any of the pathways as required."

#### Additionally, following a site visit, Martin Blakey adds:

"There is an abundance of nesting birds in the bracken etc. hence why we cannot carry out any maintenance work until the back end... In the Autumn we can then get a team in with a mini excavator to widen the paths slightly and trim back the undergrowth around the trees which have taken very well."

"I will try and get someone down to cut the brambles... once we can get in and sort it out it will be a case of keeping on top of it each year, especially cutting around about a metre strip around the new trees"

#### Hambleton History Research & Archive Association

As there have been so many new village residents here is a little background to HHRAA. The community group was formed in 2015 to research and record the history of the village as, like so many, the village was undergoing rapid change. A successful application was made to the Heritage Lottery Fund to develop a website to record village history and www.hhraa.org went live in 2017 which we continue to add photographs and information to. Membership is free to anyone living within the village boundary and members receive occasional email updates and advanced notice of the open meetings held in the Village Hall, which are normally twice a year. Children are welcome but must be accompanied by an adult.

As the social restrictions have been lifted by the Government we are looking to arrange an **Open Meeting in the Village Hall in October, the provisional date is Saturday 16th October, 2021 starting at 1400**. The meeting is open to anyone, you do not need to be a member to attend.

The meeting will include an update on the work undertaken during the Covid Pandemic, plans for the Finding Hambleton's Hidden History Project, time to look at the various displays and enjoy a cup of tea.


# HAMBLETON VILLAGE HALL

# NEWS FROM ST. MARY'S CHURCH

# Dear Friends,

The 19th July saw the lifting of the vast majority of COVID-19 regulations and as we consider how we respond to the removal of those restrictions we are mindful of the words of The Bishop of London, Sarah Mullally, who chairs the Church of England's Recovery Group:

"Many will welcome the possibilities now before us, not least increased numbers at life events and a long awaited return of congregational and amateur choir singing.



However, this is a difficult point in the course of the pandemic. Despite vaccination rates, cases are up, hospital admissions are up and long covid remains an ongoing concern. Therefore our approach needs to be cautious and careful.

Taking personal responsibility means responsibility for our neighbour, not just for ourselves, and taking precautions to protect those more vulnerable than we consider ourselves to be."

Therefore, for the time being, we ask that face coverings continue to be worn when entering the church and moving around within it. Also, when engaging with others whilst respecting social distancing they may feel they need. Face coverings may be removed whilst seated.

St Mary's will be pleased to welcome you to our regular worship on Sundays. We hope you will wish to respect our continuing efforts to keep all who visit us safe.
