PARK & RECREATION AREA

PARK AND RECREATION AREA SUB-COMMITTEE

Following the resignation of the HRAA last year, the PC have set up a dedicated Sub Committee who are working hard to ensure issues are addressed and can be dealt with efficiently and effectively.

The Parish Council have had confirmation that repairs to the car park have been scheduled. Replacement of the 6 damaged MUGA panels has also been approved and a contractor has been appointed to complete this work.

A request has been submitted to NYCC to ensure the land owners on the road up to the field are cutting back the hedgerows, as we are aware the roadway up to the Recreation Field needs good visibility.

The cabins sited at the recreation ground have showers and toilets inside. There is now a regular cleaner attending to ensure they are usable. Plans are being considered to give the cabins a face lift to improve the facilities for the clubs that use them.

We are also appealing for anyone who wants to get involved with the football teams, not necessarily to train the children, although that support would be very welcome (subject to relevant checks), but just as importantly they require volunteers who can help paint the white lines, provide sponsorship, attend the training sessions, fundraise and also support and help as required. There are plans for a Football Academy working alongside the clubs already based at Hambleton so we ask the village to offer their support in any way at all!!

We hope to be able to update you with the upcoming fixtures, any significant achievements and general information about the Recreation Areas in every edition of the newsletter from now on. VILLAGE MAINTENANCE

As a way to encourage people to pick up after their dogs, 4 bag dispensers were installed around the village. These bags are used at an alarming rate considering the amount of dog faeces still not picked up in some places. It is clear a few people are abusing the facility - at this rate it is unsustainable and the few people taking advantage will leave the majority without this facility if they continue. The Parish Council provide these bags for the odd occasions when dog walkers forget bags or do not take enough... **300 bags used in only three days from just one dispenser** - it seems highly unlikely all these bags were used for that

odd occasion! We urge you to leave the bags for when they are really needed - continue to provide your own bags for your own dog's waste! The Parish Council will continue to monitor the rate of usage.

REMINDER: There is a NO DOGS policy in the cemetery, there should not be evidence of dog fouling on graves - but unfortunately this has been reported.

Dog are NOT ALLOWED in the cemetery - respect the resting places of our loved ones.

Hambleton Isolation Help Group

Lifting of social restrictions by the Government does not mean that the risks from COVID-19 have disappeared. The Government has set out the following behaviours which are beneficial:

- Meeting in well-ventilated areas where possible, such as outdoors or indoors with windows open.
- Wearing a face covering where you come into contact with people you don't normally meet in enclosed and crowded spaces.
- Washing your hands with soap and water or using hand sanitiser regularly throughout the day.
- Covering your nose and mouth when you cough and sneeze.



Despite the lifting of restrictions people who are extremely clinically vulnerable are advised to continue to take extra steps to reduce the risk of infection with COVID 19. There are also situations where people have to self isolate so HiHG volunteers will continue to be available if you need support with shopping or collecting prescriptions.

DOG WALKERS TAKE NOTE:
