#### THE LATE BILLY SENIOR

The Parish Council learned of the very sad new that former Councillor Billy Senior had passed away. It extends its deepest sympathies to Billy's wife Hazel and the family. Billy gave a lot of time to the Parish Council and to the village; always willing to volunteer his time to help out, his efforts are very much appreciated and his contribution invaluable. Rest in peace Billy.

#### **RECREATION AREA**

The **resurfacing work for the car park** has been scheduled to start on Monday 7th February. Thank you to Core Groundworks who will be carrying out the work. As a local company, Core Groundworks have supported the Parish Council in various projects, including urgent temporary works to level the car park until the full resurfacing could take place. Their support is much appreciated and we have no doubts they will do fantastic job.

The work will mean the Recreation Area <u>car-park will be closed</u> for the duration - a pedestrian access will be set up and the field will be open but the work area, i.e. the car park, will be fenced off. Please avoid blocking Old Lane with cars during this time.

The **new MUGA fence panels** are being fitted at the end of January, action to reduce the mole hills is being taken (see below) and the PC is hoping to also get the cabin facilities a long overdue refurbishment in the near future - it really is looking to improve the facilities available for all users into the future.



#### **MOLES**

The PC is very aware of the mole issues around the village. The problem with moles is

that they hunt where the soil is moist, full of worms and grubs, meaning that they disturb the surface, leaving mounds of soil dotted around a landscape. In general, moles have small home ranges and the animal will rarely stay in the same area for a longer period of time. Their activity in a particular area may only last one or two weeks until there's no more food to be found.

We are lucky enough to live in a beautiful rural setting, but it is also ideal for wildlife such as moles. The pest controller is making extra visits at the Cemetery and the Recreation Area where the mole hills can cause distress or be dangerous and a humane option of eradicating the moles is being employed at these locations.

#### **20'S PLENTY**

The national campaign suffered a blow when proposals for the blanket 20mph limit in built up areas was rejected,



but the campaign continues and Hambleton Parish Council are proud to be supporting the campaign in North Yorkshire.

#### **MUD ON ROAD**

Again, due to our rural location, there will be times when the farmers' vehicles leave mud on the roads from harvesting the crops. This is unavoidable, especially in winter and the farmers do scrape up the majority. It can leave the road slippery, so please do take extra care.

#### HAMBLETON ISOLATION HELP GROUP

#### **Hambleton Isolation Help Group**

We are delighted to say that our registered volunteers are still helping people who are isolating for any reason and we will continue to do so until Easter despite the lifting of many restrictions.

H.i.H.G.

#### From 27th January:

- You will no longer be required to wear a face covering, including in communal areas of schools.
- However the government suggest you wear one in crowded and indoor spaces where you are in contact with people you do not normal meet.



#### The changes that came in earlier in January include:

- Staff and pupils in secondary schools and colleges do not need to wear face covering in classrooms.
- You are no longer asked to work from home
- 16 and 17 year olds can book boosters or 12-15 year olds who are higher risk from COVID 19 or if they are living with someone who is high risk can also book a booster.

If you are isolating, whatever your age, and need help with shopping, collection from the Selby Food Bank or collecting prescriptions just ring one of the numbers below and we will put you in contact with a volunteer. Your details will only be shared with the volunteer. If you have had a positive COVID 19 test please tell the person you phone so that the volunteer is aware before they contact you.

Some of the phone coordinators are still working so you may need to leave a message but we will get back to you.

The first two research sessions for the project Finding Hambleton's Hidden History will be held on:

5th February in the Village Hall, starting at 1400

Dr Jon Kenny will give training in map regression and then work continue then start as we will be bringing the maps we already hold and on-line access to other maps.

There will also be opportunity to review the data we already hold and undertake further research through the books we have and on-line databases.

A grant request has been submitted by Cllr Chris Pearson to North Yorkshire, and we should know if or what we have been awarded in the near future. The Parish Council, who administer the Hambleton (Selby) Charitable Trust, kindly agreed to provide some funds for the project in September 2020 which has now been claimed as we are able to finally start the work.
