# PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

These pages will give you an update on what the Parish Council have been dealing with and any issues that have been brought to our attention. Parish Council Meetings are held every second Thursday of the month, check the Notice Board for the most recent Minutes. The next meeting Agenda will be posted 3 days in advance of the meeting on the Notice Board.



#### **RECREATION AREA CAR PARK**

There are a few drivers that use the Recreation Area and then, on exiting the car park, try to drift their car. Whilst we know this is not malicious, it is leaving large grooves in the gravel and that means the surface is very uneven for others to drive over and could eventually cause puddles to form - which was the whole point of having the surfacing done - to stop the puddles!

Matt from Core Groundworks has already been to rake the surface back (as a volunteer!) and the damage being caused is really disrespectful to all those people who worked to get this done in the first place - for the benefit of others.

We have CCTV of the offenders, but would like to avoid having to pay them a visit. If you, or someone you know, could be one of the stars of this footage, please show consideration for other users of the field and drive carefully in the car park.

If it continues the car park will simply get chained off so that only booked clubs can use it - we don't want to do that but the PC does not want to spend public money resurfacing again any time soon.

## Hambleton Juniors end season on a High!


**Hambleton Juniors AFC** have had another fantastic season in 2021-22, with a record number of players getting the chance to play!



# Dear Friends,

The Revd Canon John Weetman and his team at Selby Abbey continue to support us. Our services, other than the first Sunday, are now in the afternoon at 3:30pm. Holy Communion on the first three Sundays. We seek to encourage families and all those with busy Sunday mornings by providing shorter and varied themed services together with the opportunity to take Communion. Indeed our afternoon services are proving to be more popular with the younger members of our community.

Our annual Rogation Sunday Service took place on the 29th May when we walked around the churchyard asking for blessing for our village, its inhabitants and indeed for every endeavour for the common good.
