

PAYING OUR RESPECTS TO THE QUEEN

The Palace's announcement of the death of Her Majesty the Queen came 15 minutes before the September Parish Council meeting. confirming a Council meeting would still be legitimate in the circumstances, it was agreed that it would go



ahead and that all attendees would join in a minute silence as a mark of respect.

As the sad news spread, flags were lowered to half mast and strict protocols for the formal ceremonies were filtered down from Central Government to the Local Authorities. This included the Proclamation of the new King Charles III being made at St. James Palace at 11am on 11th September, followed by the Regional Proclamation being made at The Castle Museum in York at 1pm and then the Local Proclamation at 4pm at Selby Abbey.

For many of us, The Queen was the only monarch we had known and after a wonderful time celebrating The Queen's Platinum Jubilee in Hambleton, the sad news has affected some of us deeply. A book of condolence has been opened at Selby Abbey and members of the public laid floral tributes in memory of the Queen. Thousands of people flocked to London to pay their respects to The Queen Lying-In-State and a National Moment of Reflection was held, a one minute silence, at 8pm on 18th September, the night before the State Funeral. Millions watched on for the Queen's funeral, an historic moment in time with pageantry and ceremony second to none.

King Charles III ascended the throne immediately following the death of Queen Elizabeth II. The Coronation will take place after a period of mourning for The Queen and we hope our Community will once again pull together to mark the Royal occasion in true Hambleton fashion and we look forward to hearing what the new Sovereign intends for the people.

Rest in peace Your Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

RECREATION AREA & GARTH DRIVE PARK

The Air-Walker at the Recreation Area has had to be removed as it had broken and was no longer safe to use. Councillor Maria Ferris is working closely with Streetscape so we hope to have some repairs and improvements made to both the Recreation Area and Garth Drive Park in the near future, including some clear signage of what is not allowed in these areas.

You would think it goes without saying that for safety reasons "Hammer Throwing" is not an activity we'd consider appropriate for our Recreation Area or anywhere other than a purpose built facility - but just to be clear - "Hammer Throwing" is not allowed. Aside from the risk to others at the time, the damage left behind from the landings creates a trip hazard for those using the pitches. The aforementioned signage will not include this but please use your common sense when using the field!

REMINDER: NO DOGS, THANK YOU

Dogs are NOT ALLOWED in Garth Drive Park or at the Recreation Area for general hygiene and health and safety reasons.

We are strongly resisting the urge to <u>chain off</u> the entrance to the Recreation Area because of the damage being done to the parking surface. Scheduled grous would be the only ones to receive a key. This would be a massive shame. Please encourage <u>ANYONE</u> you know using the car park to drive sensibly on the surface (CCTV shows it is NOT just kids), because some people are ruining it for everyone else.

PARKING ON THE ROAD

Please consider other residents if parking on a village road; avoid regularly blocking pavements or impeding access to drives or causing a hazard on the road.

Be considerate of others' point of view.

Dangerous parking should be reported to the police on 101.

Finding Hambleton's Hidden History

A further geophysical survey was undertaken on the village green on 10th September. The weather had been kind and provided some rain between July and September which meant it was much easier and quicker to undertake the survey. In the time it had taken in July to do part of the green we were able to do the whole of the green.

The data collected during the geophysical surveys will have been analysed and the results will be presented by Dr Jon Kenny. There will be displays and refreshments as usual.

Before then we are hoping to do a small dig in a garden near the Village Green to try to find out more about the school which, according to the c1840 map was there. Members will be notified of the details by email. If you wish to take part contact us and we will add you to the list. The numbers able to participate will, to some extent, be limited as it is in a private garden.



NEWS FROM ST. MARY'S CHURCH

Dear Friends,

The Revd. Canon John Weetman and his team at Selby Abbey continue to support us.

Our services, other than the first Sunday, are in the afternoon at 3:30pm. Holy Communion on the first three Sundays. We seek to encourage families and all those with busy Sunday mornings by providing shorter and varied themed services together with the opportunity to take Communion. Our afternoon services are proving to be popular.

The Village Scarecrow Festival culminated in our Harvest Festival Service on Sunday 25th September when prizes were awarded. The church had been decorated both for the Harvest Service and also so that the school children could 'Experience Harvest', when each class visited the church and stations manned by church members and discovered more about how the natural world provides rich harvests for everyone to enjoy. It reminds us all of how the fruits of the Spirit can grow in our lives – patience, joy and peace.

Our first Saturday monthly coffee mornings in church [Friday 25th Christingle making at School] are proving popular. How often we hear the comment "...what a nice church this is..". We want to continue that opportunity for people to come and look inside and discover or rediscover the treasure that is here in our Village.

November sees that special time when we go into school to make Christingles with the children. Parents, remember oranges for the 25th! The Christingle event


