ANNUAL GOVERNANCE AND ACCOUNTABILITY RETURNS

NEW 'NORTH YORKSHIRE COUNCIL'

North Yorkshire Council will become the unitary authority for all 7 North Yorkshire districts/boroughs as of 1st April 2023. The new authority will bring together all the existing council services, working in close partnership with City of York Council to unlock a devolution deal for York and North Yorkshire. County Councillor Lunn, who will continue as Councillor for North Yorkshire Council, explained it has been a difficult process to amalgamate all 7 areas' different strategies for delivering public services. He can confirm that local Planning Application decisions will continue to be made by a Local Planning Committee, onto which he has been elected; North Yorkshire is so vast and this information allays concerns that decisions would be made at a Head Office far removed from Hambleton Village.

What's new?

- Drop off point for The Clothing Bank so bring your unwanted clothes in bags please

What's different?

We were not eligible for many grants this year so we needed to look at how to recover some of the event costs. In addition to selling advertising space, there will be a charge for big activities but rather than pay for every individual ride each time, it was suggested by a group of local parents that a One-Off charge would be better, SO...

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

A STEP CLOSER TO A SAFE PLACE TO CROSS

In 2020, the Parish Council applied to the AJ1 fund; this was money raised by the sale of the historic AJ1 vehicle registration, the first number plate used in the North Riding of Yorkshire, by the Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner. To be eligible for funding, projects had to be Community based and Road Safety focussed.

The Hambleton PC application was to help fund a pedestrian crossing in Hambleton to give people a safer place to cross the A63. The application was successful and the PC was awarded the maximum amount of £20k. Unfortunately, NYCC refused permission to install a crossing. This refusal was fought for several years, with various reasons being given for why a crossing was not appropriate. An investigation is ongoing and the PC has no intention of giving up on getting a pedestrian crossing for Hambleton.

The deadline for spending the AJ1 fund was fast approaching (31st March 2023), and as a pedestrian crossing was no nearer being approved, it was decided that rather than lose the funding, it should be spent on another Road Safety project in Hambleton.

Working with NYCC and the AJ1 Panel frantically over the last few months, the Parish Council has been able to secure approval for the funding to be used to install a much improved pedestrian refuge which will be 1.9m wide!

Finally, a space big enough to fit a pedestrian pushing a wheelchair or a pram; a safer place to cross with your toddler and their bike; or cross with your dogs. It will replace one of the existing traffic islands outside the Red Lion and the size of it might also encourage drivers to slow down too, as the road will be narrower.

This is not what the PC ideally wanted, but it is the closest we could get and it will provide a *safer* location to cross the A63, which is exactly what the PC wanted to be able to offer.



Enormous thanks goes to Nicole Hutchinson from the Commissioning and Partnership Services for North Yorkshire Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner who has been a great help and had endless patience.

As mentioned, the PC will continue to advocate for a pedestrian crossing. For now, it will focus on ensuring the pedestrian refuge scheme progresses as it should via North Yorkshire Council. Updates will be given on Facebook and in the newsletter.







NEWS FROM ST. MARY'S CHURCH

his year, I chose to read Archbishop Stephen Cottrell's Book "Godforsaken" as part of my own Lenten Journey. Lent has always been a time for reflection, and I find myself wondering what the future holds for St Mary's. We have been without a vicar now for over a year. There are encouraging signs that things may change in the coming months and we will once again have a priest-in-charge. They will most likely have Haddlesey and Carlton and Drax churches to look after too, but we will have our own 'Vicar'. We have a wonderful church building - not ancient like Selby Abbey nor Birkin church; brick built and Victorian, it is none the less architecturally significant and Grade II listed. A building we, as a community, might be proud of.

'Church' of course is not really about buildings, it is about people, and so now I ponder what do we say to those who may wish to come and be our new Vicar. What do you want from your church? Is St Mary's at all relevant and if not, can it be?

Each year we have an Annual Parish Meeting - a meeting open not just to those on the Church Electoral Roll but also to all on the Local Authority Electoral Roll too. At the meeting we report on the past year and the Churchwardens are elected - yes there should be two of us! Our church needs people (and money to maintain it) to ensure it might still be here for future Baptisms, Weddings, and Funerals. Come along on the 17th May 2023 at 7.00pm. Come into St Mary's, hear what we have to say and help us.

In his book, Archbishop Stephen tells of being asked to write a prayer to go on tube trains in London and Newcastle. It was part of a national campaign aimed at encouraging people, of all faiths and none, to think about and engage in prayer in a challenging but accessible way. The prayer could only be a sentence or two.

He wrote: "My heart, it still keeps beating. But what for? Show me how to measure my life in something other than years."

Our Prayers and best wishes are with those in need, both within and beyond our village.
