

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

These pages will give you an update on what the Parish Council have been dealing with and any issues that have been brought to our attention. Parish Council Meetings are held every second Thursday of the month, check the Notice Board for the most recent Minutes. The next meeting Agenda will be posted 3 days in advance of the meeting on the Notice Board.



PLANNING, GATEFORTH LANE & THE "NEW LOCAL PLAN"

For information, the New Local Plan has not yet been adopted and therefore the 'preferred options' (preferred areas of land for building housing developments) proposed in it are not yet confirmed as 'preferred options'... this has not stopped the Developers circling and consulting with residents about possible development on these sites... cue leaflets through the door.

Consultation with the locals is seen as a positive thing in the eyes of the Planners, but what can happen is that the complaints raised in the consultation are



addressed before the application is even submitted, and the developers design-out the problem.

Having been approached by 'Banks Group' developers about a site down Gateforth Lane (to extend out the back of Gateforth Court, eastwards), the PC have explained it would be inappropriate to comment due to the New Local Plan not yet being adopted and the site therefore not yet being a 'preferred option' site.

The PC has complained to the Planning Authority that the proposed 'preferred' sites in Hambleton in the New Local Plan were not properly consulted on; one of these sites has significantly changed in shape and size and the other was actually rejected as a preferred site at the outset by planning officers. We will keep you updated on this front. The process is long and we still await answers.

Banks Group will be attending the PC meeting on 14th September at 7.30pm to present their plans for up to 65 homes on the site identified as 'Hamb-N' in the emerging New Local Plan. The meeting will be open to the public as usual.

The Councillors had the pleasure of meeting PCSO Laura Simpson at the July PC meeting; PCSO Simpson and her colleagues have been very helpful dealing with a few recent issues at the Recreation Area and with Hambleton being on her 'heat' now she would like

DID YOU KNOW??

So, having a Police Officer at the Parish Council meeting obviously led to questions about Road Safety on the A63, as this is an ongoing issue of concern for us all. It led to a discussion about Op -Snap a means for the Police to prosecute people caught committing a traffic offence on CCTV, Dashcam or passenger/onlooker's mobile phone. A villager was overtaken coming into the village recently (interestingly by someone else from the village), in a 30mph zone and footage of this could have led to prosecution - a similar case elsewhere North Yorkshire saw the driver banned for a year and fined £1500. HAMBLETON UNITED CHARITIES

Hambleton United Charities

ambleton United Charities is a small local Charity that includes 'The Poor's Land and Richardson' s Gift, 3 parcels of land within the Parish of Hambleton, which was officially registered with the Charity Commission in 1888, although it had been established many years previously. The Charity Deeds stated that the first Trustees were William Bew Todd, John Todd, Reverend Thomas Cheese of Brayton and Harris Anson. Today's Trustees are Celia Barnes, Jeff Bramley, Adam Durkin, Ingrid Millington and Cath Protheroe.

Each year the Charity receives rents from the 3 parcels of land from 2 local farmers and the Parish Council. It also receives a small disbursement from 'Brayton Poor's', being a legacy from when Hambleton Parish Church was part of the Brayton Parish Church. Over the many years the criteria in which the money could be paid to recipients has changed, with the Charity Trustees having to comply with the Trust document, written in 1888, as far as possible, in the 21st century.

For a good number of years the Trust has regularly given money to local, independent, village groups that have needed a little support and the elderly of the village have received a small Christmas gift. Some money has to be reserved for annual and any legal expenses that may occur, leaving a finite amount to be distributed annually.

The present criteria for Hambleton residents to receive a Christmas Gift are:

- 1) To be in receipt of the State Pension.
- 2) To have retired from work.
- 3) To have lived in the village for, at least, 5 years.


Hambleton History Research & Archive Association Finding Hambleton's Hidden History


Celebrating Community Spirit: Gratitude for Supporting the Village Hall!





Greetings from St Mary's.

We continue the process of preparing to advertise for a new Vicar for St Mary's. Whoever may be appointed will also be the Vicar for the Parishes of Haddlesey and also Carlton & Drax too. We pray that with God's help we will find our new priest in charge.

In the meantime, by the end of July, six more children and two adults will have been Baptised and our third wedding of the year will have taken place. It brings great joy that St Mary's continues to be available as our Parish Church for these 'Occasional Offices' and, of course, for the inevitable funerals. I've said it before, and it's worth repeating, that 'church' is about people. When these occasions arise and people feel the need to be able to come into church, it is so important that St Mary's is there for them. It is that which strengthens and heartens us in our own ministry.

As the School term ends, our work with Open the Book pauses until September; the Leavers Service will have taken place with the children receiving their School Certificates and a little book 'Your Secondary School Survival Guide' from the church. It provides an opportunity for those children recently baptised (and mums) to get together. Looking further ahead we are planning for the Village Scarecrow Festival and our Harvest Festival (including the prize-giving).
