VILLAGE PLANNING APPLICATIONS

PLANNING APPLICATIONS

The Parish Council is aware of 3 major developers looking to build residential developments in Hambleton. You are urged to have your say on the proposals via the Selby Area Planning Portal: https://public.selby.gov.uk/online-applications/

In light of so many major developments being proposed, the Parish Council will be taking the advice of a Planning Consultant who deals with objecting on behalf of Parish and Town Councils on these matters. The will be a PUBLIC FORUM at 7-8pm on Tuesday 12th December at the Village Hall so the PC can share the information and advice from the Planning Consultant.

The interest has peaked since the Selby Area Local Plan was submitted to Central Government for approval, at this stage developers can refer to the 'emerging' Local Plan in respect of sites and housing allocation etc.

In addition to the Selby Local Plan which had to find 5 years land supply for houses within the district, the new unitary North Yorkshire Council must now produce it's own Local Plan. The North Yorkshire

Local Plan can ALSO use Selby area land as allocation for its housing supply so the Parish Council urges you to voice your opinions in all the upcoming consultations.

Current Consultations INCLUDE:

- Statement of Community Involvement—
 proposes how NYC will involve the community
 and keep people up to date through the
 process. It is important they include the
 community in allocating housing supply because
 this affects people's immediate locality and day
 to day lives
- Draft Housing Strategy Consultation— a new strategy to deliver homes that meet the needs of communities across North Yorkshire. This strategy provides a <u>framework for the housing</u> <u>policies and projects that we will carry out in the</u> next five years
- Housing Allocation Policy— NYC now need to implement one policy for allocating social housing to cover all of North Yorkshire

Current Applications:

Manor Farm proposal: ZG2023/1152/OUTM

Outline application with all matters reserved except for means of access to, but not within, the site for the development of up to 150 dwellings and associated landscaping and infrastructure works. LOCATION: Land At Manor Farm, Chapel Street

This is a duplicate application, for reasons given by the developers in the covering letter accompanying the application. The PC will be sending the same response as it did to the last application, along with any additional details as advised by the planning consultant.

Gateforth Lane proposal: ZG2023/1033/FULM

Erection of 65 residential dwellings, formation of roads, hard and soft landscaping and associated infrastructure | Land East And South Of Gateforth Court

An extension for comments until 15th December has been granted to all residents, however the Planning Officer dealing with the application has explained these are major applications and likely to take some time before they are ready to be decided—planning comments can usually be submitted right up until the application goes before the Full Planning Committee.

Taylor Wimpey, Scalm Lane

No formal application as yet but the staff at the consultation at the Village Hall on Tuesday suggested they would have an outline application (access roads, not house layout or details) ready for submission before Christmas.



Tickets for Breakfast with Santa sold out so quickly we had to add more slots!! We hope Santa is ready for you lot!!




