PUBLIC FORUM WEDNESDAY 3RD APRIL


The Public Consultation on the 'Revised New Local Plan for Selby' is now live, please take some time to look at the implications for Hambleton Village. It includes proposals for 3 large sites in Hambleton, earmarked for circa 287 houses - see the map below.

The Parish Council is against these plans, and has been since the original plan consultations were open, making its opinions on the inclusion of these sites very clear.

However you feel about the proposals, **YOU NEED TO SUBMIT YOUR OWN OPINIONS THROUGH THE PUBLIC CONSULTATION PORTAL.** We can help you through this process online and will run through how to do it during the Public Forum arranged for 3rd April at the Village Hall.



Parish Council**CCTV FOOTAGE AT RECREATION AREA**

This week another vehicle owner was visited by the police after the way they drove left the car park surface left it damaged and uneven. Every time this happens, it means the precept has to be used to repair the damage. To remove the temptation in the future, there will now be a lifting arm barrier installed. It will allow pedestrians and bicycles. The teams that are based there will have access as necessary but unfortunately the risk of someone causing major damage to themselves, another member of the public or the surface is not one the PC is willing to take. Irresponsible driving on this land in the future will lead to a fine and a potential prosecution.

FLAGPOLE

Following the existing flagpole arrangement blowing down, the PC have agreed to install a replacement flagpole in front of the Christmas tree on the existing concrete slab. We hope this is in place before D-Day 80 to enable us to fly the Union Flag as a mark of respect.

Local charity Secures Funding for Community-Led Carbon Reduction Initiatives

Selby charity, Up For Yorkshire, has received a generous grant of £245k from the National Lottery Community Fund, for their Our Zero Selby project which aims to reduce the community's carbon footprint, whilst addressing issues of skills, jobs, health, and wellbeing.

During the successful pilot phase in 2022, Our Zero Selby engaged the community in shaping the project's direction, resulting in the generation of 25 innovative project ideas focused on five key themes: food, nature, buildings, travel, and consumption habits. These include a community kitchen, a library of things and repair café, establishing fruit trees and herb gardens, and domestic energy efficiency retrofit. These community-driven ideas will now guide Our Zero Selby, rooting the project in the voices and aspirations of residents.
