FLAGPOLE

The Village has a new Flagpole! After the demise of the previous pole, a brand new one has been installed in time for flying the Union Flag on D-Day 80. Thank you to the Millingtons who have always made sure the right Flag is flying at the right time and who have stored this new pole in their garden while the foundations were set!

RECREATION AREA

The new lifting arm Barrier is now installed, however, ALREADY, there are people misusing it and trying to force it up. This has resulted in several broken padlocks. D-DAY 80 AND JAMBLETON 2024

We hope you are are looking forward to another Jambleton in June as much as the Councillors are!

This year we will also be commemorating D-Day 80 and honouring all those involved in the Normandy Landings that played a crucial role in liberating Western Europe from Nazi occupation.

Over 115,000 troops, 11,500 aircraft and 6,900 naval vessels stormed the 5 beachheads; Utah, Omaha, Gold, Juno and Sword in a military assault that gave the Allied forces a foothold allowing the launch of further offensives which ultimately led to victory and the end of the war.

We will be releasing 8 doves as a symbol of Peace, one for each decade since passed and Sherburn Aero Club will perform a flypast at 2pm. We have the Daisy Belles performing songs from the era and this year the Aspire dancers have a military theme for their performance.







We will have a stand at Jambleton with a display covering the villagers and village during WW2 in line with the theme of the event, so come and say hello.



A message from the Vicar:

Two months on already and I feel as if I'm settling into these parishes. Thank you to everyone who has made Sue and myself feel so welcome. It's been good to meet people at the monthly coffee morning ('Alison's Kitchen'), at Easter services and at the school – you've been very hospitable. Hospitality is a very important part of any community – it shows love and care for the individual and builds up the relationships between us.

Sue and I spent a few years living on a Christian community in the Yorkshire Dales. It is called Scargill House (absolutely NO connection with Arthur, I promise you! – it's a geographical feature!). It was a great learning experience. Not only did we live together as a community of about 40 people, but the house took guests and led activities and services for them. Hospitality was at the heart of our lives. We loved, valued and cared for each other and the guests, which created an environment of peace, joy and generosity. These qualities are what St Paul described as 'the fruits of the Spirit' and they build up the relationships that make community.

As I write this, the next Sunday is the Feast of Pentecost (traditionally known as Whit (for 'white') Sunday). It is a celebration of the outpouring of God's Holy Spirit on those first Disciples and followers. For some it marks the birth of the Church – a community of people gathered together to celebrate all God has done in Jesus along with learning, praying and growing together in fellowship – a community blessed by the Holy Spirit.

I'm sure most of us believe in 'community' whatever its expression, but if you would like to explore further what it means to be a Church community, then please do come along to one of our services below. I can assure you of a very warm, and hospitable welcome.
