



ACT OF REMEMBRANCE 11.11.24

We must thank Rosedene Builders Ltd who made a fantastic job of laying the pavers surrounding the Memorial in perfect timing for the Act of Remembrance. Having grown up in the village, Rob Bourke wouldn't accept payment for the work, and wanted to give back to the community. We hope you agree it now looks 'complete'.



Thank you to everyone who attended the Act of Remembrance on the Village Green, we are very grateful to have you join us, we know mid week is not ideal for everyone, but still feel it is right to hold a local event on 11 November every year in addition to the national Remembrance Sunday event.

We would like to emphasise that this is a Community event, the PC facilitate and everyone is welcome to take part, make suggestions and lay a wreath or token of remembrance. Whilst it will include the traditional verse which may include references to God, it is not led by any religious denomination, and it will stay that way; this opportunity for our Community to Remember is open to all.

PLANNING UPDATE

Following an Appeal being lodged against the Selby Area Planning Committee's decision 'not to determine' an outcome for the application for development on the Manor Farm site, the Parish Council Chair, Maria Ferris, has spoken on behalf of the PC at the Selby Area Planning Committee Meeting and will be speaking at

the Appeal Hearing, to explain the PCs concerns regarding this application.

Having decided 'not to determine' an outcome for the application, Selby Area Planning Committee had to meet to discuss what it would 'be minded' to decide, if the decision was still in its hands, so it could relay this to the Planning Inspectorate at the Hearing. Councillor Ferris pushed for the Committee to 'be minded' to refuse the application, and the Committee agreed that, had it been the committee's decision, it would 'be minded' to refuse the application . However, its reason for this decision was that the proposal did not offer the amount of affordable housing that a site that size should be delivering.

Moving on to the Hearing, Councillor Ferris will attend on 27th November to put forward the Parish Council views to the Planning Inspector (too late for any outcome to be recorded in here). The Parish Council has been assisted with preparing its argument by a Planning Consultant, to ensure the most sound arguments are put across. Ultimately this decision now lies with the Planning Inspector. The outcome will be shared once the Planning Inspector makes their decision.

The other large developments proposed for Hambleton have not yet been on the Agenda at the Selby Area Planning Committee.




New pyjamas for children this Christmas, if you can, please donate a new set which will be given to families who come for help with children who will benefit.

You can come to the meetings as a visitor or join if you wish. 29th January — AGM to plan the programme for 2025




