# PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

These pages will give you an update on what the Parish Council have been dealing with and any issues that have been brought to our attention. Parish Council Meetings are held every second Thursday of the month, check the Notice Board for the most recent Minutes. The next meeting Agenda will be posted 3 days in advance of the meeting on the Notice Board.



### **NEW COUNCILLOR**

Hambleton Parish Council welcomes Keith Ferris! Coopted as the eighth member of the PC in February, he has already secured a free 3KV generator for the village hall which can be used should the village power be cut! Welcome aboard Councillor Ferris!

### PLANNING UPDATE: MANOR FARM

Most of you will have heard that the Outline Planning Application for up to 156 homes on land at Manor Farm was Approved on Appeal. A detailed FULL planning application will follow in time from the developers.

### PLANNING UPDATE: GATEFORTH LANE

The Parish Council has been informed that the NY Planning Committee intends to determine the application ZG2023/1033/FULM on Gateforth Lane at the Planning Committee meeting in April. Unlike Manor Farm's Outline Approval, this application is a FULL application.

Many of you have submitted objections. The PC will attend this meeting in order to uphold its initial objections. However, the planning officer managing the application has recommended approval of the scheme.

### **PLANNING POLICY: NORTH YORKSHIRE PLAN**

North Yorkshire Council is in the process of creating a North Yorkshire Plan to demonstrate to the Government how NYC is meeting its duty to provide land for economic growth and homes for the future.

The **first step** is for landowners to put forward land they are willing to have included in the plan. This **'Call for Sites'** is underway and NYC selects sites from this pool of land to allocate as residential /industrial development.

The **second step** will be for the NYC draft of **'Preferred Sites'** to go to a public consultation. This is where the <u>public submit observations</u> on the 'preferred sites'.

Many public consultations will form part of the North Yorkshire Plan process, covering all aspects of planning from green spaces to village/town amenities across the whole of North Yorkshire, there is a vast amount of information to process. The predicted date for completion is 2028.

### **NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN FOR HAMBLETON?**

The idea of a Neighbourhood Plan for Hambleton was raised again several years ago but there was still very little community interest - a Neighbourhood Plan MUST be made by the Community.

As none of the districts in North Yorkshire have a designated land supply to satisfy the new **National Planning Policy Framework**, which means that even if NYC Planning refuse an application, many applications will be Approved on Appeal, the PC urges the community to get involved and help take this forward, without delay.

The Parish Council can lead the initiative and will be able to employ a planning consultant and expert advisors to help the process, but it MUST be based on the community's involvement. With a neighbourhood plan the key will be to find a compromise that sees our village remain a village, but at the same time, shapes its future development to enhance facilities and amenities the residents can benefit from.







we have scanned. The website address is:


