LIGHT VALLEY SOLAR

“Light Valley Solar is proposed solar on land between Escrick, Monk Fryston, Hambleton, Chapel Haddlesey and South Milford.

The project consists of seven solar development sites totalling approximately 1,020 hectares (2,500 acres) of land, as well as additional land being used for underground cabling to connect the sites to the National Grid Monk Fryston substation.

Due to the Project’s size, it is classified as a Nationally Significant Infrastructure project (NSIP). This means that the Project will submit its application to the Planning Inspectorate (PINS), on behalf of the Secretary of State, who will ultimately decide whether to grant the project a Development Consent Order (DCO).”

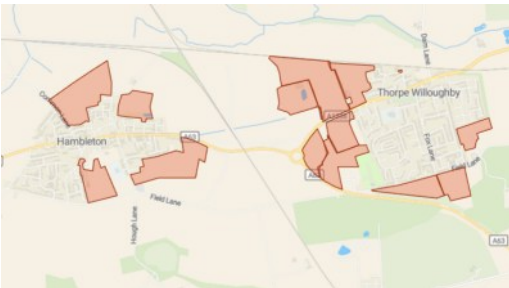
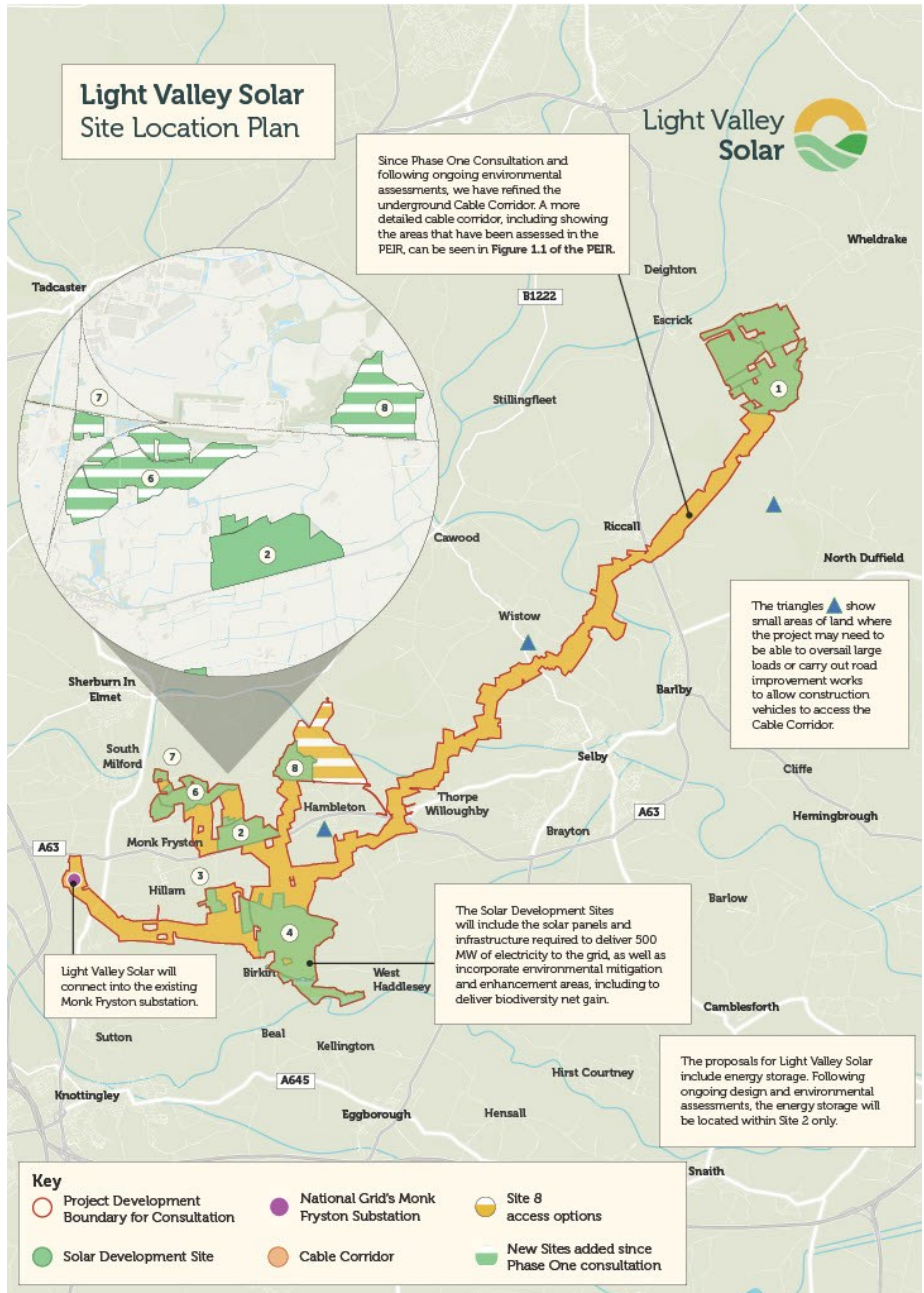
Second phase of consultation is running to Thursday 7th August 2025 . HAVE YOUR SAY.

Hambleton is being proposed as part of the Cabling Corridor to the Monk Fryston substation - the farmers have been approached but should they not want to give their land, a compulsory purchase order will be made because this is a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project - signs at field entrances identify which fields LVS wants access to. The cabling corridor is shown in Orange on the map to the right.

For those wanting to join others in objecting to the proposals, there is a residents’ group on Facebook called Rooftops not Countryside www.facebook.com/groups/againstlightvalleysolar . Thank you to those who have send objections to the Parish Council, the PC will refer to these when writing its own observations, remember the Parish Council observation holds no more weight than an individual’s.

NORTH YORKSHIRE LOCAL PLAN

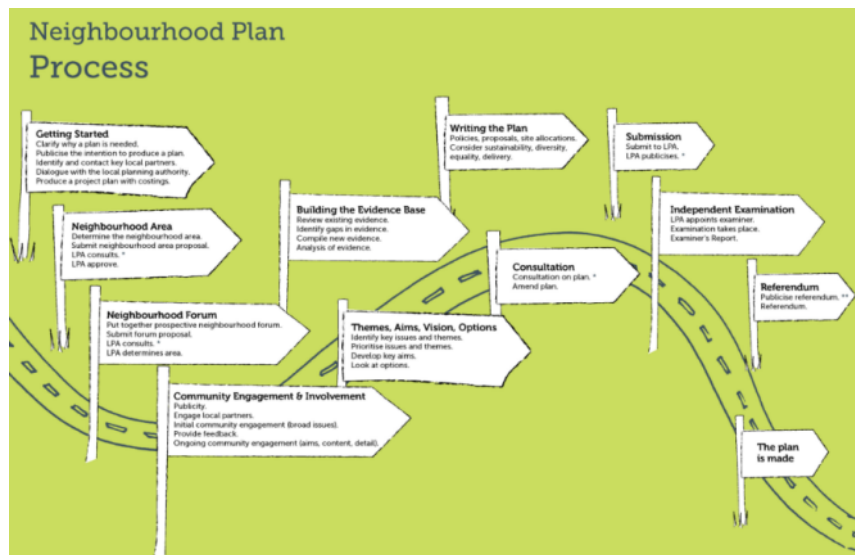
The North Yorkshire Local Plan consultation “Our First Conversation 2025” is now closed. The “Call For Sites” is still open and landowners are invited to submit land they would be willing to develop homes/ industry on. Following an assessment of all the sites that are submitted, North Yorkshire Local Plan will select their “Preferred Options” and these options will be put to a Public Consultation - at this point people can comment and object . A NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN FOR HAMBLETON?

Despite various calls to join the team, and complaints about so much development in the village, there remains no interest. This MUST be led by the community - **the PC can help to organise and guide** but it must have some volunteers to lead it.

It will help mark out how development in Hambleton happens in the future and if it can be done swiftly, it will be in place **before the North Yorkshire Plan** too. Not having a North Yorkshire Plan means **developers are able to get permission by Appeal** because the authority cannot evidence it has enough allocated land for housing supply.

OVERGROWN FOLIAGE

The PC has had numerous reports of overgrown foliage either blocking footpaths or hindering visibility from junctions. You can report specific concerns to North Yorkshire Council via the website: <https://www.northyorks.gov.uk/>. Please bear in mind the laws with regards to nesting birds March to September.

Private landowners and occupiers have responsibility for:

- ◆ ensuring growth does not obscure road signs
- ◆ maintaining visibility for road users, particularly at junctions and on the inside of bends
- ◆ ensuring growth does not prevent the passage or affect the safety of people using a road, footway, cycleway or public right of way, including cyclists and pedestrians
- ◆ removing dead or decaying trees and other growth that may fall across the highway
- ◆ removing branches that may prevent the passage of high-sided vehicles or obstruct light from a street light
- ◆ ensuring the highway is left clear of debris from cutting work
- ◆ arranging for hedge and tree maintenance works to be undertaken

SMALL HOUGH BRACKEN

Annual maintenance of the bracken in the PC owned Hough will take place in early August and should last one day, it will remain open.

DEVELOPMENTS IN HAMBLETON

Gateforth Lane proposal has been approved and is due to start imminently. The PC are now in talks about what additional support the developer, **Banks Group**, can give to our village. They have a Community Fund too, Community Groups can apply for up to £2k each (6 rounds per year) - www.banksgroup.co.uk/banks-community-fund/

Manor Farm - this development was given permission on Appeal, following many refusals. **Hallam Land Management** are looking to submit a Full planning application this summer.

Taylor Wimpey has put planning permission in for the second phase of the Whitacres estate. Many objections were submitted including from Yorkshire Water.

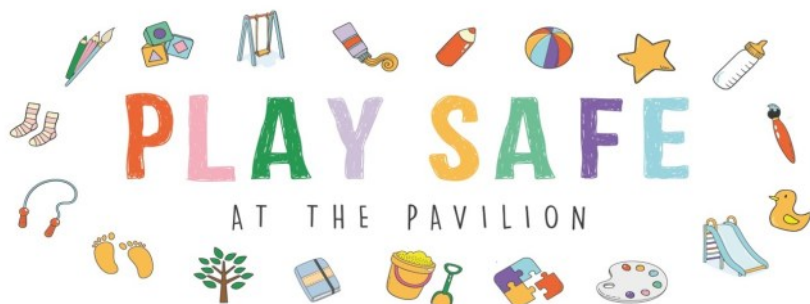

Catch Twenty Two.

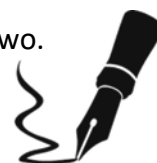
The gold no longer shines so bright,

A message from Reverend Mark:

Well I know I said last time I hope for a good summer – but usually it doesn't happen! As I write I think it's the 3rd heatwave and whilst it's lovely – my goodness me the ground needs some rain. The grass is going brown, the baskets and the tomatoes need constant watering, and the other week I got soaked whilst on my bike going through the shower from one of those industrial size hose pipes in the local fields (I was on the road at the time – you can get very wet in a few seconds!). Is it all part of the earth's natural cycle or the continuing change in climate due extensively to human industrialization and exploitation of the land. Whichever it may be there are undoubtedly worrying trends resulting in devastating fires and flooding both nationally and internationally.
