"Notice to all dog walkers who walk their dogs within the Parish of Hambleton."

Would all dog walkers please refrain from walking along the grass margins between field boundaries and those by the sides of dykes. Farmers and landowners have strict guidelines/laws to follow with the grass margins being developed, at the insistence of the Ministry of Agriculture, to encourage wild flora and fauna to flourish and to prevent leakage of phosphates and any other possible pollutants into the waterways.

Landowners and farmers are only permitted to access these margins for management purposes at certain times of the

farming year and can be fined heavily if they, or other persons, are caught misusing these areas. A number of signs have, in the past, been erected around the village directing people away from the margins and have helped but it is hoped a timely reminder will also help.

It is recognised that many residents may not know, or understand, that these strict guidelines have to be followed but it would be greatly appreciated if everyone stayed on designated footpaths, byways or lanes when walking their dogs.

PLANNING IN HAMBLETON

As we endure this barrage of planning applications in Hambleton and surrounding villages, please know that the PC have invested a lot of time into opposing them - it has the same concerns you all have and expresses these at every opportunity, with our Councillors speaking directly to the planning officers, the County Councillors and at Planning Committee meetings and Appeal Hearings. The Parish Council has no additional powers to refuse applications - it can only, as can every resident, put forward its case for refusal. In the event an application is granted by North Yorkshire Council, or on Appeal by the Planning Inspectorate (as is happening more often), the PC will then look at how we can make the developer provide benefits for our village.

We await the full Planning Application for the Manor Farm site to be submitted for consultation (Outline planning granted) and we also await the outcome of the Taylor Wimpey development application behind Whitacres.

In addition, there are various *Planning Appeals* lodged against North Yorkshire Council decisions to refuse developments in the area, including:

- ◆ AP/2025/0042/REF | Application for outline planning permission including access, with all other matters reserved, for up to 110 residential dwellings | Land At Field. *Deadline to submit comments: 15 Oct*
- ◆ AP/2025/0037/REF | Erection of a solar farm together with ancillary development thereto | Hillam Grange Austfield Lane. *Deadline passed.*

BANKS GROUP UPDATE

The Pastures, Gateforth Lane, Hambleton Update from Banks Homes September 25

We have now been operating the site since July with Connaught as Principal Contractor undertaking the earthworks and drainage installation.

The Contractors are currently undertaking Earthworks which produces soil to be stockpiled for both removal and re-use. The stockpiles will be contoured and seeded. This will provide a barrier from the construction traffic and the site compound. Surplus soil will be taken off site.

The SUDs Pond is currently under construction, and the pumping station will be constructed next over the next couple of months.

The Show Homes will start to be constructed next week having had the foundations excavated this week. The sales area will consist of one detached house, and two semi-detached properties at the front to the site off Gateforth Lane.

Banks Homes will take over as Principal Contractor in the autumn.

Banks agreed a construction route to site, which avoids the use of Gateforth Lane and Morrets Lane. If any resident sees that these routes are being used, please note the name of the vehicle and/ or the registration and pass back to Banks Homes via the email hambleton@banksgroup.co.uk

We continue to work closely with residents adjacent to the development to try and alleviate issues where possible and keep them updated

Finally, I also want to remind any community group in Hambleton that there is the Banks Community Fund and if you are interested in applying, please contact Kate on the above email.

Or important things will be missed.

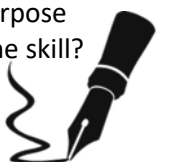
And when you walk the empty streets,

A message from Revd Mark:

Hello everybody ... as the seasons tick over into autumn, we take another step towards Christmas! ... wont be long now!

During October (on Thursday 30th Oct) St Mary's will be holding its annual **Memorial Service**. This is an opportunity for us to gather and remember with thanksgiving all those who have died. Our service will be at 7pm, and during the service we will remember by name all those whose funeral services have been held at St Mary's over the last few years as well as those requested. For **Remembrance** our service on 9th November at 3.30pm will include a short Act of Remembrance and then on Armistice Day (11th November) at 10.45am we will gather on the Green to hold a short Act of Remembrance and 2 minutes silence at the memorial. Please do come and join us for either event.

I often get asked about **making donations to St Mary's church**. People are very concerned that any monies donated will simply disappear into some church black hole. The first thing to remember is that the income for running and maintaining St Mary's church primarily only comes from the generous donations of its members and those associated with the church, giving on the church collection plate or online, some tax relief arising from those donations, coffee mornings and other fundraising activities and any grants received towards the costs of maintenance or special projects (which have to be applied for).

From this income we have to pay for the usual services (heating, lighting, water – all at business rates), all the necessary for holding our services, buildings and contents insurance (approx. £1700 last year), regular maintenance for the building and the churchyard, and we're asked to make a Freewill offering to the Diocese towards the cost of ministry (which goes towards paying for a vicar). Last year our expenditure was greater than our Income and we have not got huge reserves to dip into.

This has 2 principle affects:

- ◇ Maintaining the church fabric and keeping the church open for regular services as well as christenings, weddings and funerals becomes more and more difficult.
- ◇ If a church cannot support its contribution to the cost of a Vicar – then in future it may be absorbed into a larger group of churches and will have to run more services itself without a vicar.

There is an ongoing affect as well which is that without financial support we cannot develop the church to make it more accessible and functional for community use today.

So when making donations to St Mary's there are two approaches. One is to support us with the regular and ongoing costs without which when the reserves are gone, the future looks bleak. And the other is to make a 'restricted' donation into our 'building fund' (which can only be spent on the fabric of the building). This may enable the church building to stand but cannot be used for ministry costs (ie. to pay for a vicar), or on heating, lighting etc.

We are always very grateful for any donations made to St Mary's, and the PCC (the church council) are very conscientious and try to ensure that donations are used appropriately. If you would like to know more or would like to make a regular donation to St Mary's, please contact me below and I can provide you with more details.

St Mary's is a church for this community with a relatively short but important heritage in the area and designed by a significant architect. We want to ensure it remains a place of Christian worship which provides christenings, weddings and funerals for the people of this community. The building stands as reminder of God's presence and through its members, as a sign of God's love for us all in Jesus Christ. We thank you for your continued support.
