PRECEPT

The PC has raised the precept for the upcoming year. The 5% rise will translate to a £2.20 rise over the year for a Band D property. This is to cover rising costs to the PC including for maintenance and events.

PLANNING UPDATES

It has been a hard few years for the parish council trying to fight these applications. It cannot help but feel disappointed and let down by the current system and lack of long term plan - a default position because Selby District Council had not completed its Plan before the Unitary Authority took over and the Government changed its policies. Councillor Maria Ferris has attended and spoken in defence of our village at any Planning Committee and hearing that has concerned Hambleton parish and the PC has had professionals submit the best possible objections - however, even when North Yorkshire Council agreed with the PC, the Planning Inspectorate has overruled the objection.

Banks' Soil Bund application was granted permission.

Manor Farm Planning Application for **151 dwellings** has been submitted with reference: **ZG2025/1182/REMM**

Manor Farm planning Application for **5 self-build dwellings** has been submitted with reference: **ZG2025/1189/REM**

Please note that planning permission has been granted (on appeal) to build 156 dwellings on this site. Manor Farm, and the dwellings and access will be built. Comments on the applications above must be based on 'material considerations' and ensuring that what is built is suitable.

The PC is working with Aubergine262 to create a brand new website that meets up to date accessibility guidelines. As a public body, some information e.g. finance, must be accessible to the public. This website will help us achieve that and it will also be a place where you will be able to find all you need know about our lovely village of Hambleton.

Key Material Considerations

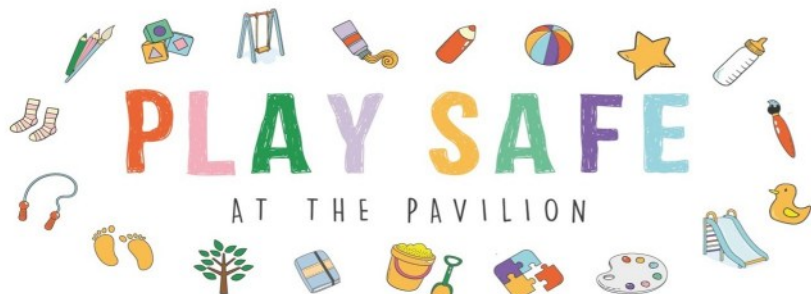
- *Design & Appearance:* Scale, bulk, layout, density, visual impact, finishing materials, and landscaping.
- *Amenity:* Loss of light/sunlight, overshadowing, overlooking (loss of privacy), noise, dust, smells, and obtrusive lighting.
- *Traffic & Highways:* Traffic generation, highway safety, road access, parking provision, and turning space.
- *Environment & Ecology:* Impact on trees, nature conservation, biodiversity, flood risk, drainage, and contaminated land.

- Loss of a private view (though loss of outlook is material).

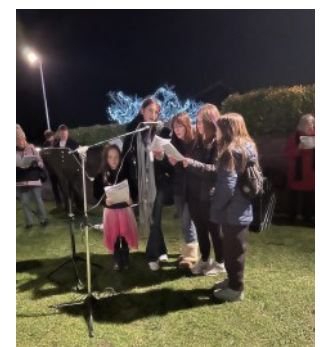

A message from Revd Mark:

Here was go ...2026! Bit of a cold start for me – you may recall I prefer sunshine and daylight, not short days and the cold! Still, the seasons are a blessing and add both wonder and beauty to our environment. I wonder if you are looking forward to anything particularly in 2026? Perhaps a special birthday, or anniversary or other event? Each year brings its days, times and events of blessing. They are the things we remember most, not just because they are special, or significant, but because 99% of the time, they are events we share with others, whether that's family, friends, colleagues or fellow travelers. And I believe we share these events with a significant other as well. I know whenever we think of Jesus at the wedding in Cana (John 2), we focus on the miracle of Him turning water into wine, but alongside this outrageous generosity is also a picture Jesus, sharing the joy and celebration of a wedding – a very special event and I believe he shares in all the moments which mark out the landscape of our lives.

There is a converse of course, our years can also be marked out by sad, distressing and anxious events. Health issues, the loss of a loved one and mental health can each cause us pain and suffering. No one is immune, life always runs the risk of distressing things happening and in these cases it would be glib to only talk of Jesus celebrating at a wedding. However, the Bible also provides us with many different images of

Psalm 23 reminds us that both by the 'still waters' and 'through the valley of the shadow of death', the Good Shepherd will walk with us bringing comfort and peace even into the darkest places.

We begin the year hoping for blessings, but even if it turns out differently, God, the Lord, the Good Shepherd walks with us through all the varying landscapes of our lives. I do hope you all have a wonderful 2026.
